1. Discussion and Possible Action on Real Racine Contract

The current Real Racine contract was signed in 1983 with no ending clause other than a six-month termination notice. The Board wishes to give the six-month notice to terminate the agreement to bring forward the opportunity to potentially renegotiate the agreement.

The Board discussed how they might be able to give ideas to MSA regarding Crawford Park. Trustee McManus will be holding a Special Parks Advisory meeting to discuss potential direction.

There was discussion regarding the rising cost of materials and the impact on the average miles of repair projected to be done this year. Road repair is on a 50-year cycle.

<u>8G – Resolution 2022-53 – A Resolution Of The Village Board Of The Village Of</u> <u>Caledonia Approving A Traffic Impact Analysis For The Racine County Youth</u> <u>Development And Care Center Proposed On Parcels Located Directly East Of 2525</u> <u>3 Mile Road</u>

The analysis has been completed, and data shows that the existing level of service after the construction of the proposed center will remain nearly the same. There was concern regarding sight distance for the proposed access point, and the driveway will need to be relocated east to ensure there is no issue with sight distance. Civil plans will need to be amended to reflect this change.

Attorney Ekes overviewed the Wisconsin Statute 66.0617 that governs park impact fees and how they might be utilized. The spending of those funds is used for new facilities, such as playgrounds. There was discussion regarding being able to use this for an access road, and there is concern about premature expenditure to the required needs analysis,

- The new IT provider has brought the physical server back up for this night's meeting, and a cloud backup is now implemented. There is a greater level of security.
