#### 1. Call to Order

#### 2. Approval of Minutes

# <u>3. Consideration and Approval for the Purchase of Sole Source Equipment - UTV Trailer & Tracks, Funded by Donations or Grants</u>

The Village is required to fund an approximate balance of \$400 to acquire a trailer of specific size and aluminum material, as no other vendors can provide said specifications.

Motion by Trustee Weatherston to approve the Consideration and Approval for the Purchase of Sole Source Equipment - UTV Trailer & Tracks, Funded by Donations or Grants and forward to the Village Board for approval. Seconded by President Dobbs. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 4. Permission to apply for FEMA-AFG Grant for the Procurement of portable radios

The Fire Department reported that their radios, which were manufactured between 2009-2014, have become outdated and are no longer supported as of 2020, causing failure. Racine County has been in ongoing discussions to replace the radio system for public safety, with no definitive timeline. The Fire Department requested to apply for a grant to support the need for portable radios, which could be integrated with whichever of the two systems Racine County decides to deploy. Discussions were held on potential funding options for the remainder of the costs and if it was included in the budget. The Chiefs provided information on the various technology and frequencies available to public safety departments.

Motion by Trustee Weatherston to approve and forward to the Village Board, the Permission to apply for FEMA-AFG Grant for the Procurement of portable radios. Seconded by President Dobbs.

This will be brought back once there has been a decision regarding the grant.

Motion carried unanimously.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

On October 16, 2022, the single-family home at 24 Jim Lin Lane, owned by Tracy Reese, experienced a sanitary sewer backup through the floor drains in the basement of the home. The Utility District was contacted at that time and responded. On October 17, the owner hired T.C.M. Sewer and Drain to come out to rod and televise the sanitary lateral. The Utility was aware of the televising. The lateral on the private property side appeared to be clear. Within the road Right of Way, (near the connection to the sewer main) it was viewed that there was an apparent overpour of grout.

In 2018, the Caledonia Utility District bid out and awarded the Wind Point Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Project to Visu Sewer. The majority of the rehabilitation work was performed in 2019. This project accomplished several things, spot repairs on offset joints in the sanitary sewer main, lined the sanitary sewer mains from infiltration, grouted lateral connections also a source of infiltration, and manhole rehabilitation. The lateral at 24 Jim Lin Lane was grouted as part of the project. As part of the rehabilitation project the grouted laterals were televised from the sanitary sewer main.

Photos of each side of the grout have been attached to this memo for reference.

The Owner has filed a claim for \$1,021.73 as a result of the backup. The amount consists of \$780.00 for TCM costs, \$56.73 for cleaning supplies, \$135.00 for cleanup time, and \$50.00 to replace the shop vac.

The Utility District has recently had Visu Sewer out to cut/remove the grout from the lateral.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Recommend that the Finance Committee determine whether the claim be paid.

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# **MEMORANDUM**

#### **Background Information**

As part of the 2022 budget, \$40,000 dollars was set aside as part of the CIP plan for the extension of sidewalk and installation of an open-air shelter at Maple Park. These funds come directly from Park Impact Fees and were to be utilized in 2022. A recommendation was made to go out for proposals to purchase and install the structure as well as install sidewalk in the park in October 2022. The 20' x 28' shelter has since been purchased in 2022 for \$21,108. The shelter is built using concrete bases, tubular steel columns, laminated wood beams, 2x8 tongue and groove decking, and a metal roof. During that time, staff has worked with contractors to get pricing on the shelter installation (labor) and the proposed concrete sidewalk.

The final cost proposals for the shelter installation are as follows:

- J.W. and Sons LLC: \$9,100.00
- Deck It Out Builders: \$15,200.00
- Carbide Carpentry: \$15,650.00

The final costs for the concrete installation were broken down into two alternatives; to install concrete from both sides of the park to the shelter and to only install concrete under the shelter and on the east side of the park. The breakdown is as follows:

- Pete's Crete LLC: Whole Project: \$23,076.00 East Side and Slab: \$12,015.00
- G.I. Concrete: Whole Project: \$26,281.00 East Side and Slab: \$13,683.75
- Wandel Contractors: Whole Project: \$40,870.16 East Side and Slab: \$24,884.40

Based on the above costs and the current Park Impact Fees dedicated for the project, the Village cannot install the shelter and the sidewalk on the eastern portion of the site within the \$40,000 budget. Based on the two lowest contractors, we have the following numbers to work with:

- Purchase Shelter, Install Shelter, and Construct Full Length Sidewalk.
  - o **\$53,284.00**
- Purchase Shelter, Install Shelter, and Construct East Sidewalk Only.
  - o **\$42,223.00**

To complete the vision of the park and install the sidewalk in any capacity, the Parks Advisory Committee will need to recommend to the Finance Committee and the Village Board to authorize the use of additional Park Impact Fees. The committee will need to decide whether or not to provide an additional \$5,000 for completing the smaller portion of the project, or \$15,000 for the full site completion. A contingency has been added in the numbers requested. The total cost for concrete does not exceed the threshold for public bidding and allows the Village the perform the work within the Village's procurement policy.

If the Park Advisory Committee is in favor of extending the sidewalk in both directions and completing the entire project, a motion is needed as recommended below. If the Parks Committee believes that the east walk is satisfactory and serves the need of the community, a motion will still be needed to request additional funds, but for only the \$5,000 total.

#### **Staff Recommendation**

PARKS - Move to recommend to the Finance Committee and Village Board to authorize the expenditure of an additional \$15,000 in Park Impact Fees at Maple Park for the installation of concrete pedestrian path connecting both the east and west sides of the park to the new shelter.

FINANCE – Move to authorize the expenditure of an additional \$15,000 in Park Impact Fees at Maple Park for the installation of a concrete pedestrian path connecting both the east and west sides of the park to the new shelter.
