4. Crawford Park Master Plan Update

Luke Geiger reviewed the online survey results with the Committee. The survey results showed that the demographics of the respondents indicated that 60% were located within Caledonia and that there was a good cross section of ages responding to the online survey. There were 547 respondents to the online survey. Peter Wagner shared, with the Committee, the results from the two public engagement efforts that were held to further engage the public as part of this process.

The first event was held on July 14th at the Franksville Beer Garden from 5-7pm. The second event was held July 17th at the Milaeger's Farmer's Market from 10am-noon. Village Engineer Ryan Schmidt and Village Administrator Kathy Kasper assisted by attending one event gathering public opinion regarding future development of Crawford Park. Approximately 77 people contributed to the events. Residents stated that they liked the effort the Village was putting forth to engage residents on this project.
